When we focus on our hurt more than we do the goodness of God, then our hurt becomes our god because it determines our decisions, actions and speech. God gets smaller and our hurt gets bigger. Sometimes our hurt drives us so far into ourselves that we become a worshiper of our hurt by spending all our time, effort and thoughts about it. Memories are strong and they affect us at the strangest times. Our memories are attached to our emotions. Thank God for Christian doctors and counselors who can put us through therapy and bring healing. I suggest if you have been severely hurt or abused you need the help of doctors. The God of all creation has gifted mankind to help each other. We are really walking in unbelief if we think we can do this on our own, God is and always has been about community. He gave Adam the gift of Eve to help him and if Adam had ignored her and tried to do everything himself, he would have been living in unbelief and disobedience to his Creator. Don't try to be your own healer and helper. The Holy Spirit can guide you to the helpers you need.

The great prophet Elijah had a horrible bout of depression and it happened right after an awesome experience with God and a great time of success in ministry. One thing that helped lift him up was hearing from God that he was not the only one still serving the Lord in difficult times. Sometimes getting together with another believer going through similar circumstances can bring us some hope. Let me point out a danger here, if we vent and dwell too long on our woes, we learn nothing and a new habit of going to people instead of God develops. Our dependency starts to rely on fragile humanity instead of the peace of God and the soothing comfort of the Holy Spirit.

Long venting sessions with Christian friends make us weaker and do nothing to prepare us for trials to come. We need to associate with followers that will both encourage us and speak needed truth into our lives even when it includes a mild rebuke.

Elijah needed some physical rest in order to restore his adrenaline and endorphins. Depression sneaks up on us just like it did with the great men and women of God in the Bible. Depressed people are still saved. David, Elijah and the apostle Paul did not keep sliding in and out of salvation; they kept experiencing the amazing grace of God through all the ups and downs of their lives.


